

Supplementary Material 12: Examples of additional outcomes included:

1. **Extended Activities of Daily Living.** Measured by scales such as Frenchay Activities Index ¹, Nottingham Extended Activities of Daily Living scale ², Lawton Instrumental Activities of Daily Living ³, Rivermead Activities of Daily Living score ⁴.

2. Quality of Life.

- **Quality of Life** e.g. EQ5D ⁵, Health- related quality of life scale ⁶, Quality of Well Being Scale ^{7, 8}, SF36 ⁹, Stroke Impact Scale ¹⁰.
- **Social activities and participation** e.g. Australian Community Participation Questionnaire ¹¹, ICEpop CAPability measure for Older people ¹²,
- **Mobility, navigation and safety** e.g. Rivermead Mobility Index ¹³, 6-minute walk test ¹⁴, functional ambulation ¹⁵, timed up and go ¹⁶

3. Psychological and mental health

- **Stroke survivors.** e.g. Hospital Anxiety and Depression Scale ¹⁷, Beck Depression Inventory ¹⁸, General Health Questionnaire ¹⁹, Geriatric Depression Scale ²⁰, discharge destination.
- **Family, friends and carers.** E.g. The Carer Strain Index ²¹, Perceived Caregiver Burden ²².

4. **Perceptual function** e.g. Rivermead Perceptual Assessment Battery ²³, Motor Free Visual Perception ²⁴, Birmingham Object Recognition Battery ²⁵, Chessington Occupational Therapy ²⁶, Neurological Assessment Battery ²⁷.

5. **Adverse events** e.g. falls, death, fatigue, accident rates.

Additional outcomes of Interest

These were

- Sensation e.g. Visual acuity, visual fields,
- Motor ability (including balance) e.g. grip strength ²⁸, Berg Balance Scale ²⁹, Postural Assessment Scale for Stroke ³⁰, Motor Assessment Scale ³¹, Fugl-Meyer Assessment ³², Motricity Index ³³
- Cognition (including attention) e.g. Mini–Mental State Examination ³⁴, Wechsler Adult Intelligence Scale (WAIS) ³⁵, line bisection ³⁶, star cancellation ³⁷

The use of these outcomes was noted, as they were considered of potential interest to readers, but no further action taken.

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
